

The Residential Treatment Programs (RTU)

The residential units are gender specific programs located in separate buildings. The programs are 3-6 months in length depending on the client's progress. We provide individual, group and family counseling, educational sessions and individualized discharge planning

Intensive Outpatient Programs

Our IOP programs provide a combination of individual, group and educational sessions to meet the recovery oriented goals of an adult population.

Traditional Outpatient

Our Traditional Outpatient Program provides a combination of individual, group and family counseling designed for individuals who are able to pursue recovery goals with minimal support. Groups and other sessions are scheduled based upon client need and convenience.

The John Brooks Recovery Center (JBRC) is a nonprofit agency providing Substance Abuse Services to the residents of NJ, particularly Atlantic County, since 1969. Our residential programs for Men and Women are located in Atlantic City on Pacific and Tennessee Avenues. There is an Outpatient Center on Bacharach Blvd. in Atlantic City providing Medication Assisted Therapy (MAT) and IOP programs for Atlantic City residents. Our main Center is located on the Black Horse Pike in Pleasantville. This site provides MAT for up to 650 adults as well as three IOP programs. Our central Admissions as well as Administration is also located there. Clients are able to access the various levels of care based upon an individual assessment. Psychiatric evaluations and medication monitoring, as well as HIV/HEP-C screening and post-test counseling is available to all of our clients. Recovery oriented Medication Assisted Therapy is integrated in all levels of care.

Clients are offered Priority status for admission- HIV+, pregnant women, IV Drug Users, Veterans and referrals from Syringe Access Programs.

Who is eligible?

NJ residents who are 18 and over (not in High School), with a substance/alcohol abuse disorder with or without a mental health problem of mild to moderate severity are eligible. There are some more specific criteria for our residential programs. Please speak to admissions about this or view our website: www.JBRCNJ.org

Financial Eligibility-

During the admission process clients are interviewed regarding their finances to evaluate funding eligibility. JBRC is part of the NJ Fee for Service Network; the Co-occurring Network and is a participant in SAI, and Drug Court. We receive funding from Atlantic County, United Way, Department of Health, Department of Children and Families and the Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services. Medicaid as well as self-pay is accepted in our outpatient programs

Medication Assisted Treatment (Methadone, Suboxone, Vivitrol)

The use of medication such as Methadone and Suboxone coupled with counseling has been proven in numerous studies to be one of the most effective treatments for chronic opiate addiction. These medicines eliminate withdrawal symptoms and dramatically reduce cravings, therefore allowing an individual to focus on recovery counseling. These medications dramatically reduce the incidence of overdoses, as well as the spread of HIV and HEP-C.

This is a long term approach to recovery requiring daily participation for medication with weekly counseling initially. As the individual stabilizes and makes progress toward recovery goals the frequency of required attendance decreases.

Vivitrol is a monthly injection which blocks the effects of opiates which has a positive impact on cravings. This is dispensed at our Pleasantville site and in our Residential units as requested.

Medication (Methadone and Suboxone is dispensed Monday-Saturday from 6AM – 12PM at both of our outpatient sites.

Single Point of Entry

As part of a multi-agency collaboration our staff conducts assessment, referral and case management services for homeless adults in need of alcohol or substance abuse treatment. The program is located at the County Building in Atlantic City.

Atlantic County Jail Re-entry Project

In collaboration with Jewish Family Services our staff provides motivational counseling and referrals to alcohol or substance abuse treatment.
