

Our story:

John Brooks Recovery Center is a private, not-for-profit corporation providing substance abuse services to the residents of New Jersey, particularly Atlantic County, since 1969.

Our journey started when John Brooks, an Atlantic City resident, former heroin addict and ex-con came to the realization that if he stopped using heroin, he'd stop going to prison. Shortly thereafter, he was inspired to start a storefront outpatient program dedicated to helping individuals with substance use disorders. Originally called Narco, Inc., which later became the Institute for Human Development and eventually John Brooks Recovery Center, the nonprofit has since grown exponentially.
